Continent- A continent is a very large area of land that is made up of several countries. The 7 continents are Europe, Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Australia/Oceania and Antarctica.

Country- A nation or region with its own government

Capital City- The capital city is where the government of a country is. This means that the leaders and officials work in the capital city.

Population-The number of people in a geographical area.

Climate- What the weather, humidity and temperature is like in place.

Precipitation- Water that falls to the earth as hail, mist, rain, sleet, or snow.

Humidity- The amount of water vapour in the air.

Physical Feature- Features that are natural.

Human Feature- Features and landmarks that have been built or put there by humans (also known as man-made).

Hemisphere- A half of the earth, divided into northern and southern halves by the equator.

Equator- The imaginary line around the middle of the Earth. It is halfway between the North Pole and the South Pole.

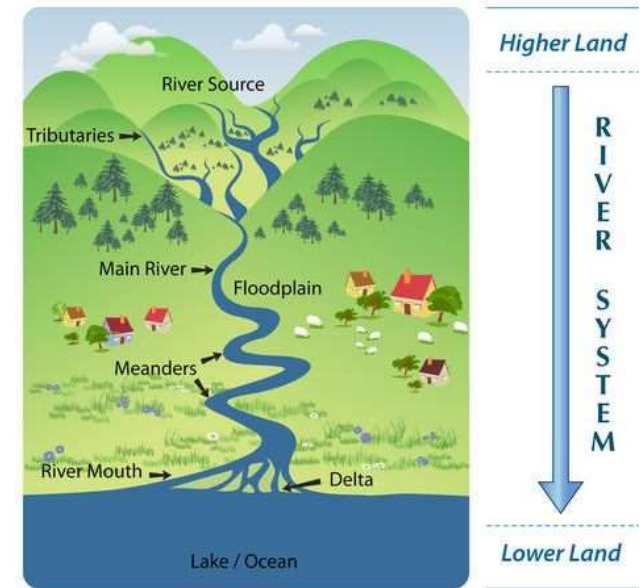


Features
