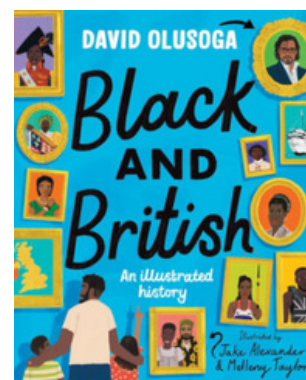


CLASS CORNER

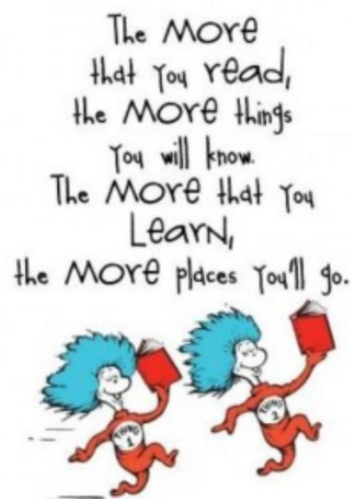
OCTOBER IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH
